Isonychia (Slate Drake)



Dun Variant

Hook	12 short shank dry
Thread	olive
Body	stripped quill from Rhode Island Red hackle
Wings	none
Hackle	spade dark dun. sized one and a half times the hook gap
Tail	very long dun hackle fibers
Originator	Art Flick, New York
Tyer	Roger Menard



Spun Dun

Hook	#12
Thread	brown
Tail	white or amber Antron
Body	sparse rust brown dubbing
Wing	tan or brown deer hair, tied Compara-dun style and spun laterally, with a "V" shape cut from the underside of the wing. The tied-in butts of the deer hair wing are left exposed, but trimmed close.
Head	sparse dubbing

Note	<i>The Spun Dun is a recent adaptation of other long-standing patterns. It can be tied in the appropriate size and body color to effectively imitate any mayfly hatch on the Esopus.</i>



Isonychia Nymph

Hook	10 Mustad 9671
Thread	black
Abdomen	dark red and plum seal blended
Thorax	peacock herl
Tail	tip of brown partridge feather
Rib	fine gold wire
Hackle	dark furnace
Thread	black
Originator	Preston Jennings, New York
Tyer	Ed Ostapczuk



Zug Bug

Hook	12-14 Mustad 9671
Thread	black
Body	peacock herl
Wing pad	mallard flank feather
Tail	three peacock fibers
Rib	fine silver wire
Hackle	brown hackle
Tyer	Ed Ostapczuk
Note	<i>This was a favorite Esopus Creek fly pattern of Arnold Gingrich</i>
